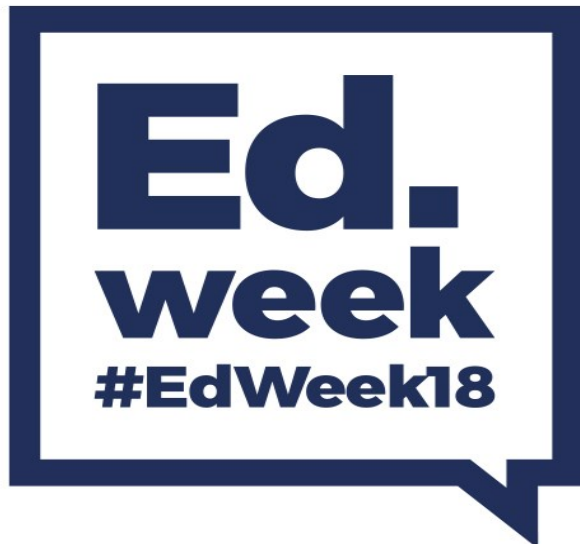


SCHOOL CHAPLAIN POSITION
