NAPLAN Online School Readiness Test

Next week students from years 3, 5 and a selection of year 2 and 4 students will sit the NAPLAN Online School Readiness Test.

The school readiness test is a 'practice run' for schools to assess their technology ahead of NAPLAN Online. The readiness test is not an assessment of student ability.

Students will not need any academic preparation for the school readiness test.

This is not a test of their literacy and numeracy skills, but an opportunity for students to experience the online test format and for the school to assess our online testing capability. There will be no reporting of student test results from the readiness test.

The school readiness test is for students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9 will be held between Monday 27th August and Friday 31st August. The school readiness test is expected



to include two online assessments for Year 5, 7 and 9: a writing assessment and a combined numeracy/literacy assessment, with Year 3 only completing the combined assessment. The duration of each assessment will be approximately 40 minutes.

Behaviour Consistency Guide

Salt Ash Public School's Behaviour Consistency Guide is used to identify and communicate the positive behaviours we expect here at SAPS. The behaviours have been categorised into levels.
