Zone Athletics

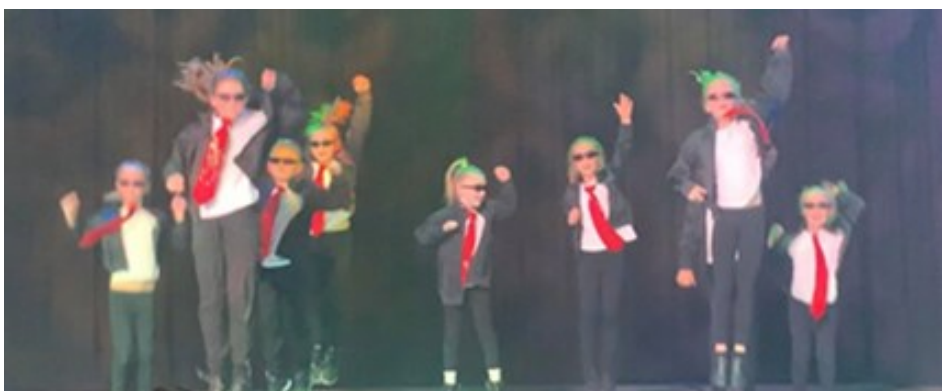
